

**ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, CRIME AND POLICING ACT 2014 (ABCPA 2014)**

**EXTENSION OF PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER**

**Made by: FYLDE BOROUGH COUNCIL (the Council)**

- A. This order extends a public spaces protection order made by the Council on 27 June 2019 ('the Original Order').
- B. This is the extension made by this order:

The Original Order is extended for three years and applies until 30 June 2025.

- C. The extension made by this order comes into effect the day following the date when this order was made.
- D. The text of the Original Order as extended is shown below:

**PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER**

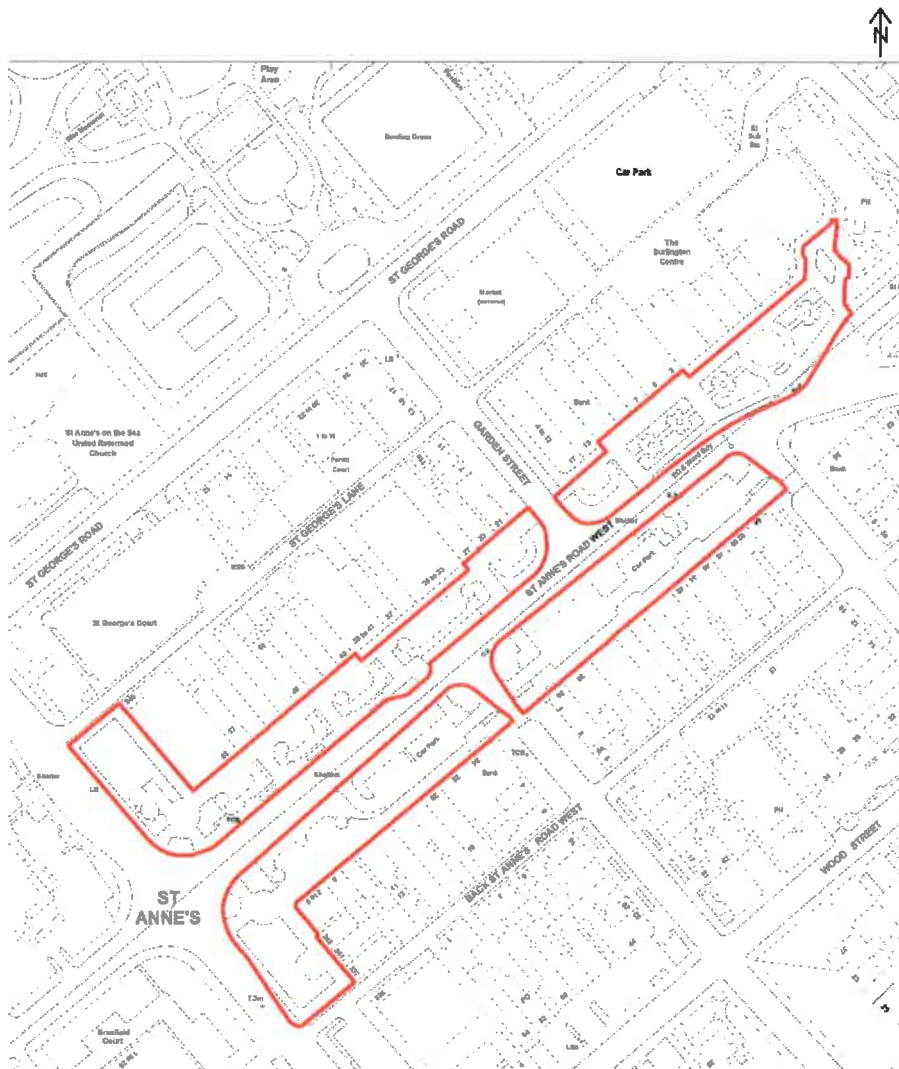

**1. THE ORDER**

This is a **public spaces protection order** made by the Council under section 59 of ABCPA 2014.

**2. WHERE DOES THIS ORDER APPLY?**

This order applies to the areas of land shown edged in red on the plan below, which are **public open spaces** in St Annes Road West in Lytham St Annes, popularly known as **the Square**.



**3. WHEN DOES THIS ORDER APPLY?**

This order applies until **30 June 2025**.

**4. WHO DOES THIS ORDER APPLY TO?**

This order applies to **any person**.

**5. WHAT DOES THIS ORDER REQUIRE?**

This order requires a person to **not light or cook on any barbecue** in the areas where the order applies.

It also requires a person to **not bring any barbecue into any area** where the order applies with the intention of lighting it or cooking on it there, knowing that doing so is prohibited.

"Barbecue" includes any outdoor temporary cooking facility or equipment.

**6. ARE THERE ANY EXCEPTIONS?**

The requirement in paragraph 5 above does not apply if the Council has given written permission to use a barbecue at a particular time and place, and the barbecue is used at that time and place and in compliance with any conditions attached to that permission.

**7. WHAT CAN HAPPEN IF I BREACH THIS ORDER?**

You can be given a **fixed penalty** notice of £50. Or **you could be prosecuted** in the magistrates' court for a criminal offence and be fined up to £1,000.
