We are a warehouse, selling gifts online. I want to sell and export craft spirits via Amazon's fulfilment service. We have been selling online for 7 years. There will be no direct sales and we are not open to the public.

Amazon already has a strict set of guidelines in place for the sale of alcohol which include but are not limited to:

Orders can only be made by verified account holders over the age of 18

Deliveries require photographic evidence that the person accepting the alcohol is over 18 years. Alcohol will not be left on the doorstep and would not be delivered.

Terms and conditions are all on each alcohol listing

Amazon sellers need to provide their Personal licence details and the Premises licence before they can sell.

Amazon transactions are kept indefinitely, and all records are available for the police or any official authority.

No alcohol shall be delivered to any person who the driver considers to be intoxicated.

We will not offer or operate "on demand" types of online sales or delivery through services such as Deliveroo, Just Eat or similar.

Details of the personal licence holder will be kept on the general notice board.

Our warehouse has cameras, the yard is locked and secure.

We will not be allowing collection, advertising the sale of alcohol from our warehouse, sales will be online only.

Alcohol will be kept in a secure room in the warehouse accessed by specific employees and stock checked monthly.

Appropriate fire fighting equipment shall be provided on the premises.

Alcohol storage and distribution will be added to our risk assessment

Deliveries to Amazon warehouses will be made using existing haulage arrangements – no extra traffic volume or disturbance will be made. This is done between the hours of 9am and 5pm. There are no pickups outside these times.

Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

We are a secure warehouse, there will be no sales of alcohol to the public directly – only via online sites with the relevant permissions. All online locations have the legal notices showing that alcohol sales are for over-18s and stating that photographic evidence will be required to deliver alcohol

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

No sales will be made at this location. We operate our business during standard hours and no further traffic, noise or disturbance will occur as a result of our sale of alcohol through Amazon. No one will be allowed to consume alcohol on the premises and the warehouse is not open to the public.

c) Public safety

No public are allowed onsite, there is no public access. No further traffic will occur on the access road.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We are not open to the public. There will be no consumption of alcohol on the premises. Sales of alcohol to the public via Amazon are in line with UK national guidelines.

e) The protection of children from harm

No children apart from employees family, will ever be onsite as we are not open to the public. Alcohol will be stored in a safe location. It is then transported to Amazon fulfilment centres

Amazons policy to prevent harm to children and avoid illegal consumption and purchase by those under 18 years is to require a valid ID when delivering alcohol to the public and/or a passcode that is only available to the account holder – Only registered Amazon accounts with those over 18 years can purchase alcohol and Amazon has sophisticated systems in place to ensure this is not abused by minors.

Amazon listings that show alcohol sales carry standard over-18 declarations in line with national policy – there statement on alcohol sales is below:

Age Restricted Items

Certain items available on Amazon.co.uk are age-restricted.

By placing an order for one of these items, you are declaring that you are 18 years of age or over. These items must be used responsibly and appropriately. There are a number of measures in place to confirm that a customer is eligible to purchase an age restricted item. One of these measures is asking customers to provide a name, date of birth and address during checkout for the purchase of age-restricted products.

Delivery by Amazon (Amazon Logistics)

Delivery of age restricted items via Amazon will be to the address on the shipping label, to a redirected address designated by the customer, or the reception of a commercial building. Valid photographic ID of the recipient will be required upon delivery. An age restricted item can be delivered to another adult over the age of 18 at the same address.

We take our responsibility in relation to the sale of age-restricted items extremely seriously. To confirm the recipient is over 18 years, valid photographic ID with a date of birth may be required upon delivery. The driver will input your year of birth into their device and may then require an ID check to complete the age verification process. The driver will not record any other information, take photographs of your ID document or be able to access your information once the delivery is complete. The year of birth is stored securely in Amazon's systems. This way we can ensure that any legal obligations with respect to age verification have been met and will be deleted according to our retention policy.

Delivery to a locker, pick-up point or nominated safe place location is not available for these items. If there is nobody at the address aged 18 years or over, who can show valid photo identification and accept the package at the delivery address, the item will be returned to Amazon for re-delivery the following day.

If your order is being delivered to a commercial address or residential apartment block, the receptionist, concierge, or mail room attendant receiving your parcel, must provide a valid photo ID, showing they are aged 18 or over. If they can't, the parcel will be returned to Amazon for re-delivery the following day.

- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (a defence identity card issued to serving military)

Delivery by Royal Mail

Although age-restricted items can't be delivered to a locker or a nominated safe place location, they can be delivered to a Royal Mail Local Collect Post Office / Enquiry Office / Delivery Office, for age verification at collection.

Royal Mail will ask for your year of birth at the point of delivery and will ask to see valid photo identification if the recipient is, or appears to be, under 25 years of age in line with their UK "challenge 25" policy. The delivery person will input your year of birth into their device and will not record any other information, take photographs of your ID document or be able to access your information once the delivery is complete. The year of birth is stored securely in Royal Mails systems and will be deleted according to their retention policy.

Royal Mail will leave a 'something for you' card following any unsuccessful delivery attempt of an age-restricted parcel and will bring it to the nearest post office for collection with an age verification check. Alternatively, you can use the information on the 'something for you' card to contact Royal Mail to arrange a redelivery.

 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
