

# ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, CRIME AND POLICING ACT 2014 (ABCPA 2014)

## EXTENSION OF PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER

Made by: FYLDE BOROUGH COUNCIL (the Council)

- A. This order further extends a public spaces protection order made by the Council on 28 June 2019 ('the Original Order') and previously extended by an order dated 1 June 2022.
- B. This is the extension made by this order:

The Original Order is extended for a further three years and applies until 30 June 2028.

- C. The further extension made by this order comes into effect the day following the date when this order was made.
- D. The text of the Original Order as further extended is shown below:

## **PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER**

Made by: FYLDE BOROUGH COUNCIL (the Council)

# 1. THE ORDER

This is a public spaces protection order made by the Council under section 59 of ABCPA 2014.

### WHERE DOES THIS ORDER APPLY?

This order applies to the following **car parks** provided by the Council (which includes all off-street parking places provided under section 32 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other land used in association with them, whether or not the land falls within a marked parking bay): North Beach, North Promenade, St Annes Swimming Pool, Fairhaven Road, St Paul's Avenue, Stanner Bank, Dicconsen Terrace (Lytham Green), and Bath Street (Lytham Green)

## WHEN DOES THIS ORDER APPLY?

This order applies until 30 June 2028.

### 4. WHO DOES THIS ORDER APPLY TO?

This order applies to any person.

# 5. WHAT DOES THIS ORDER REQUIRE?

This order requires a person to **not light or cook on any barbecue** in the area where the order applies.

It also requires a person to **not bring any barbecue into an area** where the order applies with the intention of lighting it or cooking on it there, knowing that doing so is prohibited.

"Barbecue" includes any outdoor temporary cooking facility or equipment.

#### 6. ARE THERE ANY EXCEPTIONS?

The requirement in paragraph 5 above does not apply if the Council has given written permission to use a barbecue at a particular time and place, and the barbecue is used at that time and place and in compliance with any conditions attached to that permission.

# 7. WHAT CAN HAPPEN IF I BREACH THIS ORDER?

You can be given a **fixed penalty** notice of £50. Or **you could be prosecuted** in the magistrates' court for a criminal offence and be fined up to £1,000.
