What's Happened So Far?

Major regeneration and improvement works in St Annes Square were substantially completed in August 2025, marking a key milestone in the delivery of the St Annes Masterplan.

Fylde Fest Lights Up the Transformed Square

The revamped Square is already proving to be an incredibly vibrant events space. Filled with sunshine and smiles in October, the first ever Fylde Fest brought all the festival fun to mark the official launch of the exciting new Square. Hundreds of residents and visitors enjoyed a packed afternoon of free family entertainment.

St Annes Square Regeneration

The improvements have breathed new life into the heart of St Annes whilst carefully preserving its cherished character, creating a more accessible, connected and vibrant space for residents and visitors alike.

Key enhancements include:

- Wider pavements for improved accessibility
- Retained car parking spaces
- Enhanced transport connectivity including new bus lay-bys and seamless links between the railway station and bus services
- New salt-tolerant plant varieties
- Stylish benches with integrated LED lighting
- Electricity points in five domes to support events
- Free water refill stations
- Upgraded street lighting
