St Annes Improvements

Pier Link & Garden Street: Latest Works Update

Garden Street

- Tarmac foundations have now been laid near Saltrock, ready for the distinctive Kellen paving featured throughout the St Annes Improvements Projects.
- Planters with bespoke granite kerbs are giving the street real character.
- The new kerb line is taking shape, with granite kerbs being installed throughout.

Pier Link

- Planters are complete and filled with soil ready for planting.
- Paving on the Lord Derby side is nearing completion, with work now moving to the corner where St Annes Road West meets Clifton Road Drive North.
- The original York Stone paving reclaimed from St Annes Square has been carefully re-laid and jet washed outside St Annes Pier.
- An additional zebra crossing at the North Promenade will provide a crossing point for each side of the Pier.
- New red tactile paving is now in place, blending heritage with modern accessibility.
- Traffic signal infrastructure is being installed as part of a signal upgrade, with temporarily traffic lights controlling the flow of traffic while the works take place.
- The footpath on the Town Hall side of the Pier Link has been redesigned to retain the area's traditional character while providing a durable and attractive surface. Kellen block paving will be installed from the corner of North Promenade to the Town Hall entrance, before transitioning into grey tarmac. Reclaimed York Stone will be used on the curved section of the footpath from the Pier Link to Clifton Drive.



Garden Street Undergoes Works to Protect Trees

Great News for Garden Street's Trees

We're pleased to share that the Garden Street scheme has been carefully designed with tree protection at its heart. Three existing trees will be retained and safeguarded, with only one small tree needing to be removed.

To keep our trees healthy throughout the works, the team is going the extra mile with:

- Protective fencing where space allows
- No-go zones to keep machinery and materials away from roots
- Hand excavation near roots instead of heavy machinery
- Arboricultural supervision throughout

And it doesn't stop there. The new design will actually improve conditions for our trees in the long run, with permeable surfaces, better drainage and tree-friendly materials replacing some existing hard surfacing.

It's a great example of how regeneration and nature can go hand in hand, giving Garden Street's trees the best possible chance to thrive for years to come.
